



# Application Procedure

## How to Apply

All prospective students need to complete the College Application Form. A copy of the form will be attached to the Course Listing – further copies can be obtained on request. Application can also be made online via our website at: [www.deaf-college.co.uk/apply](http://www.deaf-college.co.uk/apply) and click on: apply online.

School leavers and Learning and Skills Council (LSC) applicants should apply through their Connexions Personal Adviser at their local Connexions office. Applicants under the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) scheme should contact the Disability Employment Adviser (DEA) at their local Jobcentre. The DEA will contact the Residential Training Unit (RTU) to ensure eligibility for funding. DWP applicants who are invited to an interview should arrange a travel warrant through their DEA before the interview. In all cases, early application is recommended. We accept enrolment throughout the year.

## Interview Process

When an application has been received, along with additional background information (annual review/s, school/college report), the applicant will be invited to attend a one-day assessment at the College. The potential student will meet a range of professionals, including a Programme Manager – responsible for the course chosen, a member of the Student Support Team, Audiologist and medical staff. The applicant will also undertake a Basic Skills Assessment.

If appropriate, an offer of a place will be made, subject to financial approval from the relevant funding authority. Successful applicants will then be informed of the start date and will receive a detailed information pack about the procedures for College entry.

## International Students

Increasingly our College is called upon to fulfil an international role in educating and training deaf and hearing-impaired people. Applications are welcomed from prospective overseas students, providing they are able to arrange the necessary study permit and funding.

## Funding

Our College accepts students aged between 16 and 63 years, who, depending on age and the type of course proposed, are sponsored either by the Learning and Skills Council (LSC), the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) or Social Services Departments.
